"I really want to do well in front of my friends and family," said Leandri. "I am really used to driving on these roads. It's a route I know well, which I like and is well suited to me. Also I know the car very well now so everything has come together to enable

me to put in a good performance. I also have the advantage of benefiting from the Peugeot Rally Academy drivers Jérémi Ancian and Craig Breen. This is a big plus."

Leandri's local knowledge has taught him an important lesson about the demanding island stages: "The stages are long and hazardous so you have got to stay concentrated all the time. The quality of the opposition is very strong so I need to

fight hard to do well. But I am just very impatient to get going and feel so motivated
